Will be next Wednesday, January 25. The planning group is continuing practices from last year's move to using outreach staff that work in the community, along with Downtown Ambassadors. They are developing a list of areas where people are known to be outside and gathering their personal information ahead of time rather than needing to wake people up to get their information the night of the count. Care packages were put together by Bethlehem Church/Heartside Neighborhood Collaborative Project volunteers that will be given out.

Other communities are doing youth counts supplemental to PIT. This is an option that has been discussed, however there has not been capacity to do one in the past.

Kent ISD liaisons have been contacted each year, but the information has been difficult to gather. Sierra will be doing a lot of the de-duplication work when Jim is gone. For media purposed, best to wait to release numbers to avoid two releases, one correcting the other. Important in crafting the
