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3B. Project Description

1. Provide a description that addresses the entire scope of the proposed project.

Annually, over 300 households in Kent County are served directly by two domestic violence (DV) shelters with immediate, albeit short term, protection and support. Transitional Housing is utilized for victims of DV when accessing permanent housing, through formal permanent housing supports, with natural supports or otherwise, is not a realistic or safe option due to access barriers, safety concerns and/or social-emotional barriers. Project HEAL (Housing, Education, Advocacy and Legal assistance) provides up to 24 months of TH that is dedicated to victims of DV and their children when intensive supportive services and housing support are both needed to maintain safety. The HUDfunded portion of Project HEAL maintains 19 scattered-site apartments for survivors in several large apartment complexes within the community. Intakes are coordinated with entities interfacing with DV victims through a community coordinated entry plan developed by the providers and Centralized Intake (the Housing Assessment Program). All households accepted into the program are offered case management services which are focused on safety, recovery and accessing permanent housing as quickly as possible. Program goals: 80% of households exit into sustainable permanent housing, 63% of leavers have a higher level of income from that at entry, and 40% of leavers have some level of employment income. To these ends, coordination with community services is critical. Goodwill, Women's Resource Center and Bethany Christian Services (employment training), Network 180 and internal YWCA Counseling Center (counseling), the DHHS, WIC, 4Cs (mainstream benefits, nutrition, childcare), are all resources accessed by advocates routinely.

HEAL advocates facilitate linkages and utilize program resources to access legal services through Legal Aid of Western Michigan, and pro-bono attorneys. The program supports educational expenses for survivors and assists with transportation. Supports for daily living needs; basic apartment furnishings, food, medication and utility payments are also available, utilizing a strength-based model for problem solving around living expenses. Families have free access to other YWCA services for victims/survivors: support groups, individual and family counseling, emergency shelter, permanent housing referrals/advocacy, sexual assault and child sexual abuse service. Project HEAL is one component of the YWCA's trauma-informed response to domestic violence.

Project HEAL prioritize moving to permanent housing as quickly as possible, while incorporating the crucial elements of safety and recovery from domestic violence as part of its service design. Access is low barrier, and although designed for 24 months of service, most households exit to permanent housing in approximately 11 months. HUD identifies that TH is a critical and correct service for some families fleeing violence. Project HEAL responds to this need.
