A continuing resolution was passed for one year, keeping federal funding at the same level as FY24; Courtney noted without the cost of living increases to keep up with fair market rate increases, fewer people will likely be served through this funding. Courtney noted the CoC will send out a survey soon to better understand how the HUD funding delays are affecting the community.
