Host Homes and Coordinated Entry					

#### **Host Homes and Coordinated Entry**

#### Discussion

Brianne presented overview and initial process of host homes. Presentation provided by Heather and Dani. Dani reviewed issues in the past from this kind of model and discussed why this program should be successful going forward. Courtney inquired about what exits from host homes looks like. Dani and Heather answered and included information about continuing services past participation in host homes. Dani explained that you with a minor child are eligible and also that their homelessness status would not change while in the program. Tammy Vincent asked for further clarification on how financial assistance is provided. Dani responded that the financial assistance could go to youth or the host but would most often go to the host. \$500/household and no official start date as of right now. Further question from Eileen regarding safety and consent. Dani explained program agreement and capacity for an exit plan.

Brianne explained the electronic google form to use to refer youth to the program. All responses will be received by Brianne and she will monitor youth names on youth BNL and will prioritize based on assessment score with LOT as a tie breaker as needed. Considering HMIS referral form in the future but not as of now.
