proposed creating a universal emergency shelter and street outreach data set that is updated							
monthly at the Data Analysis Committee pending development and approval of a formal structure							
at the February 15 Data Analysis meeting. Johanna Schulte motioned to approve this proposal, with							
support by Lee Nelson Weber. This committee discussed what information they would like to see on							
this report, including emergency shelter use capacity, demographics. There was general discussion							
around the limitations of data, using it responsibly, and data quality.

Several other reports, including the PIT Count and System Performance Measures Report are not fixed yet. Evan noted that these issues are across the board for vendors, and Wellsky is in the middle of the pack for updating reports.

Evan reviewed the LSA 2023 Metric Comparison, and this committee noted an increase in adult-only households experiencing homelessness. There was discussion around the reason for this jump and determined 5 issues to look into for clarity.
